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The mission of the Gale-Ettrick- Trempealeau School District is to provide an education based upon a strong academic foundation in order to equip all students with skills to be productive and responsible citizens.

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District is a consolidated district comprised of the City of Galesville and the Villages of Ettrick and Trempealeau. It is located in the southern-most part of Trempealeau County on Highway 53, approximately twenty minutes from La Crosse.

The School District includes 6 school buildings: 3 elementary school, 1 middle school, 1 high school, and 1 alternative school. The middle school opened in September 2009. Additions and remodeling at Trempealeau Elementary and GET High School were completed during the 2009-2010 school year. In addition, 2018 saw the completion of a new multi-purpose outdoor athletic complex which includes a track and multi-use turf field. A state of the art Performing Arts Center is scheduled for completion this fall. The elementary schools all offer Great Beginnings (Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau 4-Year-Old Kindergarten Program) programming at all three elementary buildings.

The G-E-T School District is a leader in technology innovation. The District purchased MacBook Airs and iPads for staff and continued with the purchase of over 1,300 iPads for our K-12 students Our new technology will enhance the learning opportunities for all students.

Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) is in place in the G-E-T School District. It provides a GATEway to discover the potential of high ability students and coordinate services and resources for them so they may achieve success and well-being throughout their educational career.

The district offers excellent instrumental and vocal music programs, and over 15 very competitive sports teams. An excellent and active booster club supports the District, as well as parent-teacher organizations at the elementary level and a very involved Educational Foundation.

Galesville is home to the G-E-T High School, the middle school, Galesville Elementary School, and the alternative high school. Galesville is located about 20 miles north of La Crosse, Wisconsin, in the Coulee Region of the Mississippi Valley. The city sits among rolling hills, towering cliffs, forests and spring-fed streams.

Ettrick is home to the Ettrick Elementary school. Ettrick is about 8.5 miles northeast from Galesville.

Trempealeau is located 7.5 miles southwest of Galesville and is home to the Trempealeau Elementary School. Trempealeau is located in the middle of the Wisconsin Great River Road and has been voted as one of the ten most scenic drives in America. The community of Trempealeau is located along the Mississippi River with Perrot State Park nearby. Each community celebrates an annual event or festival between July and early October.
