- <u>International Baccalaureate</u> (IB) programs in OHS aim to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring people who help create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.
- <u>Service Learning</u> On a Service Learning Tour, teachers and high school students work side-by-side with local residents to help tackle global challenges—forming new cultural connections and empowering communities for generations to come.

#### REFERENDUM INFORMATION

The community passed, in 2016, a comprehensive facilities plan that addressed capacity and high priority capital maintenance needs at 4 elementary schools and the high school main campus and east campus. The projects addressed growth, aging buildings, and modern learning environments. The total project cost was not to exceed \$54.9 million.

The successful candidate will possess and exhibit skills and experiences in the following areas:

The Oconomowoc Areas School District and community possess many assets for the children served in the district. The district overall has benefitted from stable leadership which has been critical in addressing the unique needs present in the 2020-2021 school year and beyond. The Interim Superintendent, as an experienced educational leader, must possess an understanding of what students, staff and parents need as issues related to the pandemic continue to be addressed.

Additionally, the Interim Superintendent must possess excellent communication and listening skills and will need to demonstrate approachability and humility with numerous stakeholders. An understanding of the healing process will be necessary as the Interim Superintendent engages with community stakeholders and staff and leads to better unite various stakeholders in support of the children served. With mental health needs becoming more apparent, this individual must have a focus on meeting these needs.

The district has developed a quality strategic plan. The Interim Superintendent must have the skills to develop an understanding of the plan and have the necessary skills to support the strategic plan work called for during the period the Interim Superintendent serves.

As an experienced educational leader, the Interim Superintendent must have skills in mentoring the administrative team.

It will also be important that the individual have skills to nurture an effective board-superintendent relationship and to work with the board consistent with knowledge about board governance and appropriate board and superintendent roles and responsibilities.

Overall, this position calls for a listening-first leader and one that views challenges with the positive opportunities they can create for children. As an unwavering advocate for children, the public schools and the school district, this individual will need to have collaborative, partnership-oriented skills. Key skills in being transparent and relationship and trust building skills will be needed.
