School District of Thorp *

The School District of Thorp is a PK-12 district housed in a single building. The school is conveniently located just off of highway 29 which is the major 4-lane highway connecting the Twin Cities and the Fox Valley. The school building contains the PreK-6 elementary school, 7-8 junior high, and 9-12 high school. The district strives to create a high-performing, student-centered school district that meets the needs of the current student population and attracts new students to our district.

Children that reside within the boundaries of the School District of Thorp have a variety of options. Their options include all educational programming sponsored by the district, attendance at private schools participating in the Wisconsin Private School Choice Program, virtual schools sponsored by the district and other districts in the state of Wisconsin, full-time open enrollment to other Wisconsin public school districts, youth options, course options, and home-based private educational programs. Parents of children with disabilities are also advised that there is a special needs voucher program.

The School District of Thorp has one of the top FFA/Ag programs in the state. With two greenhouses and a new wind tunnel, the program produces food for the school lunch program, grows/nurtures flowers that are sold to the public, remodels one tractor a year and provides landscaping to community families. Furthermore, the district promotes PBIS activities throughout the elementary and middle school. RtI is at the forefront of making sure students are equipped with the essential interventions needed to be successful in life.

Technology is an important aspect of the learning environment in the School District of Thorp. All students in grades 7-12 are issued a Chromebook they can use in school and at home to meet their educational needs. Elementary students also have Chromebooks which are kept in the classroom.

In addition, Middle/High school students may seek to participate in many other co-curricular activities such as; Archery Club, Band, Chorus, Drama, E-Sports, FabLab, FBLA, Rube Goldberg, Ski Club, and Trap Club. Also, the District is proud to have won the 2014 Division 5 State Boys Basketball Championship and the 2016 State Division 4 Softball Championship.
