

The School District of Shell Lake is located in Washburn County in scenic northwest Wisconsin, 90 miles north of Eau Claire. Shell Lake is just 6 miles from Spooner, WI, 16 miles from Cumberland, WI and 24 miles from Rice Lake, WI.

The District has just completed a renovation to bring everyone under one roof. In addition to our campus with various fields, we have an approximate 15-acre School Forest. District offices and grades PK-12 are housed in one building.

The District has tried to invest in technology and provide iPads for K-6 classrooms, Chromebook carts and labs for elementary and middle school students, and a Chromebook for each student grades 9-12.

We offer many diverse opportunities for students, from our athletics to co-curriculars. Our students are able to participate in what excites them most, often without needing to choose one sport / talent over another. One of Shell Lake's most unique features is it's crystal clear 2,580-acre lake that is well utilized by swimmers, boaters, campers, and fishermen.
