The district operates three PreK-5 elementary schools (Evergreen [1994], Trailside [2001], and Woodfield [2001])

WGSD is in the seventh year of a stakeholder-driven strategic initiative that emphasizes evidence-based decision making, continuous improvement systems, and policy governance.

The Waterford Graded School District with its strong support for its schools voted in support of a \$24,900,000 referendum in 2019. Due to this community support for education, the Fox River Middle was doubled in size and completely remodeled. WGSD has completed an initial defeasance and has saved the taxpayers considerable future interest payments. The district benefits from an active and supportive community that is engaged in a redevelopment project of the downtown. The district embraces a small town culture and is surrounded by the many amenities of greater Milwaukee area.
