It is located in north central Wisconsin in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. The successful candidate will demonstrate the ability to bring the school system and communities together in a partnership for student learning.

As the leader of the Chequamegon School District, the candidate must be calm, open-minded, yet decisive and a motivational manager who can bring out the best in people. They should be an innovative problem-solver and have a background in and understand of all aspects of the educational process.

The next superintendent will need to demonstrate a strong ability in each of the following areas:

People Skills: The candidate should:

- Possess the ability to listen and work with staff, students, board of education, and community.
- Be approachable and highly visible in the schools and in the community.
- Be willing to participate in the community through community organizations and events and be vested in the community.

It would be helpful if the candidate had knowledge and understanding of rural schools and rural communities.

Leadership: The candidate should:

- Be a collaborative leader who appropriately involves staff members as well as those affected by the decision-making process.
- Effectively recruit and retain staff members.

Possessing an understanding of the opportunities of a consolidated school system would be beneficial.

Communications: The candidate should be able to:

- Establish a network of consistent and frequent district communications to internal and external stakeholders through a variety of media.
- Understand and explain school district instructional programs and financial issues to community members in a clear and consistent fashion through various media formats.
- Promote and market the district to parents and others who live in the surrounding area.

Child Advocacy: The candidate should:

- Be an advocate for all children, no exceptions.
- Have knowledge of the learning process at all school levels.
- Be able to work with staff, parents, and school board members to prioritize the resources needed to ensure high levels of learning for all.

It would be beneficial if the candidate had successful classroom experience.

Culture: The candidate should:

- Have knowledge and experience assessing, building, and sustaining a positive district culture.
- Demonstrate interpersonal and leaderships skills that will bring staff together to work toward a shared vision of continuous improvement in all areas of the school district.

The Chequamegon School District is located in Price County in northern Wisconsin. It serves the communities of Park Falls and Glidden in two buildings. The North Campus includes: Glidden Elementary (PK-3) and Chequamegon Middle School (6-8). The South Campus includes: Park Falls Elementary (PK-5), Chequamegon High School (9-12), and Class ACT Charter (9-12).

The school district has zero debt and a fund balance of \$6.8 million.

You may be wondering, "What makes the Chequamegon School District special?"

CSD has five unique schools on two different campuses that are part of the largest district in the state. It is also part of the Rural Virtual Academy (RVA) consortium, which may be of interest to home-school families.

- Park Falls Elementary: Consistently named an Academic "Beating the Odds" School by the Department of Public Instruction.
- Glidden Elementary: Challenging, effective multi-age strategies are used in this small school setting.
- Chequamegon Middle School: What if this age-group could have a "school to themselves"? We made that a reality, with excellent results! Named a "Title 1 School of Recognition" and a "Beating The Odds" School by the Department of Public Instruction.
- Chequamegon High School: Named One of "America's Best Schools" by USA Today! WATCH US SOAR!

More than 10 school district buses cover the 741 square miles that comprise the Chequamegon School District, including the communities of Park Falls, Fifield, Glidden and all rural areas within the district.

The former Chequamegon and Nicolet National Forests were combined into the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest in 1988. The Forest covers more than 1.5 million acres of northwoods and is home to the blackwell Job Corps Civilian Conversation Center and Mondeaux Dam Lodge. It surrounds and encompasses the district and its residents.
