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About the School District



Located at the base of Eagle Bluff, which towers 550 feet above the Mississippi River, Fountain City features Merrick State Park, a municipal park and ball field, a vineyard, historic and contemporary restaurants, Kinstone (Wisconsin's own Stonehedge), Mississippi Thunder Speedway and much more. Traveling down the Great River Road to Cochrane and Buffalo City, families can enjoy The Grove Golf Course, the Scenic Valley Swimming Pool or one of the many parks. Dubbed "Big Buck Territory," the region offers outstanding hunting and fishing opportunities as well as beautiful hiking and biking trails. Day trips to La Crosse and Eau Claire are easily accomplished as both cities are about an hour away. Winona, Minnesota is a 20-minute drive from most locations within the district.

Families, local residents, and businesses offer their time and talents to support local youth. Some of these organizations include:
