The Nekoosa School District is a 3K - 12 grade level district serving 1,100 students in three school buildings and an additional 220 students in a virtual charter school. NSD consists of one elementary school, one middle school that includes a STEM Academy, and one high school that includes an alternative school and a virtual charter school. The staff includes 8 administrators, 95 teachers, and 54 support staff. The annual operating budget exceeds \$19,000,000.



Nekoosa School District's greatest assets are our dedicated, caring staff, active parental involvement, and our supportive community. The school district community showed their support of education in April 2020 when they approved both of our referendums on the ballot. The \$2,900,000 capital referendum for a new athletic facility and an operating referendum to exceed the revenue limit by \$2,000,000 each year for the next five years were both aproved.

The new athletic facility replaced the football/soccer stadium, replaced the track, updated the softball field, and built a state of the art concession plaza. The operating referendum allowed our district to retain our outstanding staff, hire a social worker, hire a math coach/interventionist, hire a second tech ed teacher, upgrade equipment in the technical education (shop) area, and hire a second WISE Academy teacher. With these additions, our district is in a great position to serve our student needs.



About the Community



The city of Nekoosa, with a population of approximately 2,600, is situated on the beautiful Wisconsin River. The district covers a vast area of 178 square miles which includes five municipalities; City of Nekoosa, Town of Armenia, Town of Port Edwards, Town of Saratoga, and the Town of Rome. The Town of Rome is built around a tri-lake area nine miles south of the city of Nekoosa in Adams County and is home to the new Sand Valley golf course. The townships of Port Edwards and Armenia, west of the city, are primarily agricultural.

There is much to do in the Nekoosa area. Cross-country skiing and walking trails as well as a frisbee golf course are located on district property for the community to use. A beautiful bike trail connects Nekoosa, Port Edwards, and Wisconsin Rapids and runs through Nekoosa's beautiful Riverside Park. The river and three lakes (Arrowhead, Sherwood, and Camelot) provide great fishing, boating, and swimming.

Nekoosa is home to the Pumpkin Fest held each October where the biggest pumpkin in the state is determined, and is also proud to be home of Walleye Days each spring.
