The Pardeeville Area School District serves 860 students in three schools: an elementary school (4K-grade 4), a middle school (grades 5-8) and a high school (grades 9-12). The district takes pride in providing a diverse array of opportunities for all students to enhance their learning experience and to ensure continuous student success. The district is also known for its longevity of staff staying in the district.

The district is currently working with Findorff and Groth Design Group for a possible referendum in 2025. Community conversations and refining needs for the building and the school district are in the process of being finalized. Positive community support has been seen in previous referenda that have passed.

In 2019, a fine arts addition was unveiled that included music rooms and a 500-seat auditorium. These facilities complemented the sports complex that was completed in 2016.


District Highlights

 Awarded the Mental Health Service Professional Demonstration Grant in 2023 (a consortium with 3 other local school districts). This grant will help fund counselor interns to assist in student mental health needs as well as mental health professional shortages.



- A Day of Service was implemented on May 10, 2024. Members of the student body were involved in acts of service throughout Pardeeville and neighboring communities.
- In its 16th year, the Bulldog Stomp 5K Run/Walk draws many community members and registrants from afar. This year, \$45,000 was donated to the Carbone Cancer Center in Madison.
- Connections are made with the community to celebrate its veterans with an annual program and meal.
- A comprehensive curriculum is offered that includes Advanced Placement, dual credit and numerous CTE courses in agri-science, healthcare, apprenticeships, business and technology education, as well as an excellent music program.
- The Lenz Auditorium is utilized by the drama and music departments for student performances and community events.
- Pardeeville High School students can earn Community Service Honor Cords for doing 200 hours of community service.
- Graduating seniors have numerous scholarship opportunities available through the generosity of the local community.
- Extracurricular opportunities include Art Club, Bulldog Stomp, Drama Club, FBLA, FFA, Forensics, Key Club, NHS, Skills USA, Spanish Club and Student Council.
- Athletic programs include cross country, football, volleyball, cheer and dance, curling, girls and boys basketball, wrestling, baseball, softball, golf, track & field, ice fishing, powerlifting and a trap shooting co-op.

About the Pardeeville Community



Located in north central Columbia County surrounded by beautiful lakes, nature areas and parks, the Village of Pardeeville (population 2,050) is a peaceful residential community. Pardeeville is 10 miles from Portage, 35 miles north of Madison and 35 miles from Wisconsin Dells.
