REFERENDUM INFORMATION

The MPSD community has generously supported the district, approving four operational referendums from 2015 to 2023. The most recent approval extends through 2028.

On April 1, 2025, district residents will vote on MPSD's first capital referendum since 1997 (plus a \$1.4 million referendum to support school lunch in 2004). The district is seeking approval to borrow \$25 million for district-wide critical facilities maintenance focus on safety, security and building structure.

District administration is committed to making budget cuts and not using all of the funds approved in the 2023 operating referendums to keep the school district property tax rate flat in the next budget.

Meanwhile, a Community Facilities Advisory Committee will be meeting from February 2025 through next fall to make recommendations to the Board of Education on how to address \$161 million in long-term facilities needs.
