About the District

REFERENDUM INFORMATION

On Tuesday, April 1, 2025, the community will vote on a non-recurring operational referendum question for the Viroqua Area Schools. If the referendum is approved, the district will be able to exceed its state-imposed revenue limit by \$1.3 million per year for the next two years. Referendums were passed in 2005, 2010, 2015, and 2020 to exceed the revenue limit for operating expenses.

In 2022, a \$20.5 million referendum was passed to create secure entrances at the elementary and middle/high school buildings, reconfigure traffic flow to improve safety and efficiency, address Americans with Disability Act (ADA) accessibility requirements, enhance underutilized classroom areas, expand tech ed classrooms and labs to support additional offerings including agriculture, woods, metals, and automotive and promote high-quality programs and hands-on learning opportunities.

DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

- SIX SCHOOLS IN THE DISTRICT:
 - Viroqua Elementary School (4K-4); Viroqua Middle School (5-8); Viroqua High School (9-12); and three charter schools: Viroqua Area Montessori Charter School (4K-8), Laurel High School (9-12), and Vernon County Better Futures High School (10-12).
- High schools offer eight in-person Advanced Placement (AP) courses (and many more online), seven dual enrollment courses, and two academies with Western Technical College.
- Achieved U.S. News Awards for many years.
- The Viroqua Early Learning Center opened in March 2023. In response to the community's need for childcare, the district used district funds, one-time federal assistance, and available state grants to purchase a former assisted living facility for the ELC.
- The James P. Bigley Pool, located on the campus, is a year-round indoor aquatic facility offering swim lessons, lap swimming, water exercise classes, and open swim for all ages. Managed by the district, the pool provides a welcoming environment for fitness, recreation, and community engagement. The Bigley Pool opened in 2003.
- Viroqua Area Schools is a member of the Coulee Conference.
- 21 Interscholastic Sports Programs: football, volleyball, boys/girls cross country, boys/girls basketball, boys/girls wrestling, boys/girls hockey, boys/girls tennis, boys/girls golf, gymnastics, softball, baseball, boys/girls powerlifting, and boys/girls track. The district also provides interscholastic opportunities for middle school students in volleyball, cross country, boys/girls basketball, wrestling, and boys/girls track. There are football, baseball, and softball opportunities for middle school students and soccer for all ages in our community. Students are very involved in drama, forensics, music, eSports, FBLA, FFA, Skills USA, and Visual Arts Classic. Letters are awarded for athletics, the arts and academics.

About the Viroqua Community

Located in the heart of the Driftless Area, Viroqua Area Schools is surrounded by the rolling hills and scenic valleys of Vernon County in southwestern Wisconsin. Communities served include the City of Viroqua; and townships in Vernon County (Coon, Franklin, Genoa, Hamburg, Harmony, Jefferson, Kickapoo, Liberty, Sterling, Viroqua, Webster) and Crawford County (Freeman). Madison is 90 miles to the southeast, and La Crosse is 35 miles to the northwest. Larger cities are easily accessible, but there is something for everyone in this eclectic community. The populations of Viroqua and Vernon County are 4,437 and 31,170 respectively.

The Viroqua community has a long history of supporting education. Viroqua is also home to a satellite campus for the Western Technical College. A common lobby space connects the WTC building to the McIntosh Memorial Public Library.



Viroqua has a vibrant downtown including several well-known restaurants, a restored theater and historic hotel. The Viroqua Chamber assists with downtown revitalization, business enhancement and industrial development, seasonal farmer's markets, music events and numerous cultural arts activities throughout the year.

The area supports a variety of recreational pursuits including hunting, fishing, skiing, hiking, ice skating, swimming, hockey, snowmobiling, golf, biking, canoeing, camping, and fitness classes. The Viroqua Parks and Recreation Department also has youth programs for all ages.

Vernon Memorial Healthcare includes six area physician clinics – Bland Clinic-VMH, Hirsch Clinic-VMH, VMH Family Practice and Complementary Medicine, La Farge Medical Clinic-VMH, Kickapoo Valley Medical Clinic-VMH and VMH Outpatient Specialty Care; home health and hospice services; three retail pharmacies.
