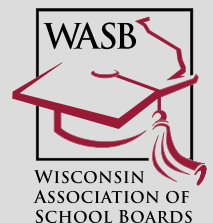

About the District

The Tomah Area School District is the largest school district in the area, serving 3,063 students in twelve buildings that span across three counties: Juneau, Monroe and Jackson. The district is deeply connected to the community and committed to academic excellence, student engagement, and supportive learning environments. It values strong partnerships with families, local organizations, and the broader community—creating an aligned, student-centered educational ecosystem.

REFERENDUM INFORMATION

In 2023, a four-year \$2.5 million operational referendum was passed for non-recurring purposes to maintain and enhance educational and technology programs; school safety, security and school facilities; and to maintain current levels of operational expenses.

- With its close proximity to the only Army installation in Wisconsin, the district proudly serves over 200 military-connected students.
- Beginning with the 2025-26 school year, a four-day, all-day 4K program was implemented.
- A TASD Distinguished Alumni program was established in 2017 to inspire district students.
- Graduating seniors have numerous scholarship opportunities available through the generosity of the local community.
- The District's academic offerings include traditional, alternative ed, early childhood, Montessori, extensive programming in the career education that prepares students for workforce and technical tracks, and secondary college/prep pathways, including a JROTC program.
- Tomah Area School District supports a broad range of athletics, arts, and clubs, including music, show choir, drama, DECA, FFA, and academic teams.
- As a proud member of the Mississippi Valley Conference (MVC), students enjoy: strong, competitive athletics; meaningful rivalries; robust extracurricular programs; and opportunities for leadership and teamwork on and off the field.

Tomah is a vibrant, welcoming, and strategically located city in western Wisconsin. Home to approximately 9,500 residents, Tomah blends small-town warmth with regional importance, earning recognition as “Where the I Divides” at the crossroads of Interstates 90 and 94. Located approximately 45 miles east of La Crosse, 80 miles southeast of Eau Claire, and 100 miles west of Madison, this unique position makes Tomah a key hub for transportation, logistics, healthcare, and industry—while still maintaining the charm and connections of a close-knit community.

The Tomah Area School District consists of 22 municipalities—two in Jackson County, four in Juneau County and 16 in Monroe County.

A Community Rooted in Connection and Pride - Tomah residents enjoy a friendly, collaborative atmosphere where community pride runs deep. Families, military-connected households, young professionals, and retirees all contribute to the city’s diversity and hometown spirit.
